

Dr. Marko Stanković, Associate Professor

BIOGRAPHY

Marko Stanković was born on 16 August 1980 in Belgrade. He finished elementary school “Svetozar Markovic” as the holder of a diploma “Vuk Karadžic” and graduated the Third Belgrade High School with honors. He enrolled at the University of Belgrade Faculty of Law in 1999 and graduated in 2003 with an average grade 9.90. During his studies he received a scholarship of the Ministry of Education and Sports of the Republic of Serbia. As one of the best students in his generation, he was commended and awarded for outstanding success.

In October 2004 he became a teaching assistant at the Faculty of Law in Belgrade. He enrolled at the postgraduate master studies at the Faculty of Law (Department of Constitutional Law and Political System) in 2003. In April 2004 he was awarded the scholarship of the Ministry of Science and Environmental Protection for 200 young talents for master courses and their involvement in research projects. He participated in the project “Improvement of Organizational Structures” at the Economics Institute in Belgrade. In June 2005 he passed the verbal MA examination (“with distinction”), and in March 2007 he defended (“with distinction”) the thesis entitled “Belgian federalism”. This thesis was published as a monograph released by the “Official Gazette of the Republic of Serbia” and the University of Belgrade Faculty of Law in 2009.

In August and September 2006 he used a grant for the Summer University of the Institute of Federalism in Fribourg (Switzerland) on “Federalism, Decentralization and Diversity”, where he received a “Diploma with Distinction”. In September 2008, while he was working on his doctoral dissertation, he visited Germany (Frankfurt-Oder and Berlin), where he conducted research and collected literature for his doctoral dissertation and attended summer school on “The European System of Human Rights Protection”.

He defended (“with distinction”) his doctoral dissertation entitled “Constitutional Judiciary in Modern Federations” in October 2010 at the University of Belgrade Faculty of Law

and gained the academic title of doctor of legal sciences. He became assistant professor for Constitutional Law on 30 March 2010.

He performs all forms of teaching (lectures, exercises, exams) at the subject Constitutional Law starting from school year 2010/11. He teaches the subject Law of Local Self-Government starting from the school year 2013/14 and his book “Local Self-Government in Serbia” (published in February 2015) is used as a textbook for that subject, by a decision of Teaching and Scientific Council of the University of Belgrade Faculty of Law.

He became associate professor at the Faculty of Law for subjects Constitutional Law and Law of Local Self-Government on 22 March 2016.

He speaks English, French and Russian.
